

## **S.S.A. Schedule Confirmed**

The Super Sedan Association has finalised their 2006/2007 season calendar, with the A.S. Concrete Pumping Super Sedan Championship Series to be staged over 16 rounds of competition at seven tracks in two states, with a good balance between regional and metropolitan venues. Several of these events will incorporate rounds of the Ian Boettcher Nissan Super Sedan Series, the second-tier SSA competition established to encourage new drivers and provide a competitive environment for low budget and occasional racers.

The A.S. Concrete Pumping Service Super Sedan Championship Series will get underway at Brisbane International Speedway on September 30, the first of seven shows slated for the Archerfield circuit. Two weeks later (October 14) the series returns to Brisbane for round two, with Toowoomba's Charlton Raceway staging round three on October 28. Round four at Brisbane on November 11 is the start of four consecutive weeks of racing that includes events in Toowoomba (November 18), a return to Brisbane on November 25 and the first of two visits to Lismore Speedway on December 2.

Bundaberg's Carina Speedway will be the host venue for round eight on January 13. Gympie's Mothar Mountain Speedway (February 10) and Rockhampton Speedway (February 17) will host rounds nine and ten respectively on consecutive weekends. The series returns to Brisbane on March 17, with the prestigious Grenville Anderson Memorial event in Lismore on March 24 included on the schedule for the first time. It's back to Brisbane again on March 31, followed by the two-night Grand Prix of Queensland in Toowoomba on April 7 and 8. The revamped Maryborough Speedway will host the penultimate round on April 21, while Brisbane will once again stage the series Grand Final on Saturday, May 26.

Each round will pay a minimum first prize of \$1000 to the winner of the feature event, with special events such as The Grenville and the Grand Prix of Queensland to carry significantly more prizemoney. Eight rounds will also feature the Ian Boettcher Nissan Super Sedan Series, with Brisbane, Toowoomba, Bundaberg, Gympie, Rockhampton and Maryborough all staging duel fixtures.
